Background:

Tobacco Control Program has been considered as one of the complex and dynamic public health area. There are still many measures that have to be prioritized to bolster the adequacy of tobacco control efforts. Demand-side interventions and supply-side interventions both have to be addressed in order to achieve the tobacco free generation.

The death and disease that tobacco products have inflicted are devastating. Tobacco has been identified as the foremost cause of death and disease that is entirely preventable. Tobacco use will kill more than 8 million people worldwide each year and **more than 13 lakh** people die every year in India due to diseases related to tobacco use and as per the report of Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), nearly 50% of cancers in males and 25% cancers in females in India are directly attributed to tobacco use.

Karnataka has been one of the progressive states in implementation of the National Tobacco Control Program in India. It has achieved many milestones to advance tobacco control program by expanding National Tobacco Control Program from two districts to all 31 districts in a span of 3 years. All the districts in the state has a functional District Tobacco Control Cell to actively take forward implementation of NTCP at the grass root level. All the districts are also monitoring the NTCP activities and reporting regular progress through the national monitoring and information system meant for NTCP reporting.

Each District Tobacco Control Cell has its unique contribution to tobacco control program whether implementation of tobacco free educational institutions, tobacco free offices, tobacco free villages, tobacco vendor licensing or implementing the WHO FCTC Article 5.3 policy guidelines. Each district has built its own success story and which needs to be told and shared with others.

With this background, the STCC, Karnataka in collaboration with The Union and NIMHANS is organizing 'Mantana 2023 - A State Level NTCP Review Meeting' on 16th and 17th March 2023 at NIMHANS Convention Centre, Hosur Road, Bengaluru.
